DR. MOLEFI ASANTE

FRIDAY-APRIL 19, 2024 6:30 PM KEYNOTE SPEAKER

The role of the Black church has indeed been historically significant, serving as a pillar of support, resilience, and activism within African American communities. Over the years, several factors have influenced shifts in its influence and significance. How can Christian Educators address Civil Rights, Black Culture today?

Molefi Kete Asante is the President of the Molefi Kete Asante Institute for Afrocentric Studies. Asante is Professor Extraordinarius at the University of South Africa. He is the Founding Editor, Journal of Black Studies and first director of UCLA's Center for Afro-American Studies. Asante, often called the most prolific African American scholar, has published more than 100 books, among the most recent are Africa's Gifts of the Spirit; Being Human Being: Transforming the Race Discourse (with Nah Dove); The Perilous Center, or When Will the African Center Hold; Radical Insurgencies; The History of Africa, 4th Edition; African Pyramids of Knowledge; and, the memoir, As I Run Toward Africa. Asante has published more than 500 articles and is considered one of the most quoted living African authors as well as one of the most distinguished thinkers in the African world. He has been recognized as one of the 10 most widely cited African scholars. Asante has been recognized as one of the US Library of Congress. He attended NCI, Southwestern Christian, Oklahoma Christian, Pepperdine, and UCLA.

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



II. OTHER MANEUVERS AND RESOURCES FOR BEING ON THE TEACHING FRONTLINE

A. Lesson should include a variety of teaching methods,

B. Incorporate the seven laws of learning

- I. Know thoroughly and be familiar with the lesson to be taught.
- 2. Gain and keep the attention and interest of students.
- 3. Use words which both teacher and student understands.
- 4. Begin with the known and proceed to teach new information.
- 5. Stimulate the students' minds to action.
- 6. Require students to reproduce lessons in thoughts and actions.
- 7. Review, review, and review

C. Begin the lesson period with engaging pre-session activities.

- I. Always start your lesson with a prayer and with activities to <u>hook</u> learners' attention and set the stage for the lesson.
- 2. Focus on the Bible lesson and get into the **book**.
- 3. Guide the learners to <u>look</u> at how the lessons can be applied and related To people, events and circumstances today.
- 4. Close the lesson activities, the <u>took</u> phase, with inspirational words that Express what has been learned and what will be done with that information.

III. LESSON, STUDENT AND TEACHER EVALUATION

- A. Evaluate students through oral and written tests, observations and records.
- B. Teachers should evaluate themselves on continual basis to determine the Effectiveness of their lessons' preparation and presentation.
- C. The Evaluation of the lesson should be measured by the effectiveness of visual aids, student participation through responses, and application process.





The theological term apologetics comes from the Greek word apologia, which literally means "a reasoned statement or a verbal defense". To give an apology, then, unlike the more current definition of "I'm sorry," is to defend and argue for a particular point of view to go against the grains of heresy. We find a mandate in Scripture to defend the faith, a mandate that every Christian must take seriously. In 1 Peter 3:14b-16, the Apostle writes, "Have no fear of them [those who would harm you], nor be troubled, but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame". The work of Apologetics is helping Christians know what they believe and why they believe it. Also it provides a defense of the truth claims of the faith in Jesus the Christ. This course will demystify the different ways that the world tries to confuse, alter, or change truth, namely truth about the facts of the Gospel. Naturally, it will give doctrinal emphasis to enlighten truth of the Gospel so that teachers in the Kingdom of God will be able to build their faith, and others faith, as well as defend the faith. Some of the movement of this session will include:

- 1). The Task of Apologetics in the Modern World
- 2). The Authority of the Bible in Biblically Illiterate Times
- 3). Jesus' Teaching that Helps with Primal Doctrinal Issues
- 4). The Trustworthiness of the Teaching of Jesus



CARUTHERS, Jefferson AD5 — Difficult Bible Questions and How to Answer Them



Dr. Jefferson R Caruthers, Jr. is a native of Anaheim, California. He is the son of a gospel preacher, Jefferson Caruthers, Sr. His father, J. R. Caruthers, Sr., attended Nashville Christian Institute (1948-1951) after encouragement from the late L. H. Alexander, his preacher in Midland, TX. Jefferson Sr. studied under the late Brother Marshall Keeble. Jefferson Caruthers, Jr. is one of eight children born to Brother Caruthers, Sr. and Mabel Caruthers.

Jefferson Caruthers Jr. became a Christian in Santa Ana, California (1969) under the preaching of Brother William Brown, who then ministered to the Westside Church of Christ in Santa Ana. Jefferson Caruthers, Jr. is a graduate of Southwestern Christian College (A.A., 1980), David Lipscomb College (B.A., 1982), Harding University Graduate School of Religion (M.Th.1987), Cleveland State University (M. Ed., 2004), Faulkner University (MPhil 2017). He completed the Doctor of Ministry (DMin) in 2018 at Hood Theological Seminary. Dr. Caruthers attended

Kearley Graduate School of Theology of Faulkner University where his PhD dissertation focuses the African American Hermeneutic in Churches of Christ.

In 1983, Jefferson Caruthers, Jr. married Felecia Sandrelli Spinks of Auburn, Alabama. They are the parents of seven children, one son in law, one daughter-in-law, seven grandchildren: Chava (Mike Mash, little Mikey, Cecelia, Carina and Marciano), Jefferson III, Carmen, Joshua (Jasmine Caruthers, Jai Evan Caruthers, Jonah Cole Caruthers, Jericho Bryant Caruthers) Hayley, Joel and Jonas (the last two are twins). Sister Caruthers also attended David Lipscomb College and is a graduate of Memphis State University (B.S. 1985), and the University of Mississippi (M. Ed., 1990). She has also completed the Master of Library and Information Studies with a concentration in Archival Management at the University of North Carolina Greensboro (2019).

In 1988, Jefferson Caruthers began work for Northwest Mississippi Community College in Senatobia, Mississippi. During his tenure, he taught pharmaceutical math as well as GED preparation courses under the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA). He taught at several cities in north Mississippi before transferring to be a high school instructor at Senatobia High School (1992-1994). Other teaching experiences include Martin Luther King Jr. High School in Cleveland, Ohio where he worked as instructor, Intervention Specialist, and wrestling coach (certified in English, Math, History, Science grades 1-12) beginning in 2001. In 2005, he relocated to Winston Salem, NC and has worked as theology instructor at the School of Religious Studies (Little Rock, Arkansas) since 2012.

Jefferson Caruthers has been preaching since 1977. He has ministered to the Central Avenue Church of Christ in Coldwater, Mississippi (1983-1993), and to the Adams Avenue Church of Christ, Cleveland, Ohio (1994-2005). Teachers will learn how to prepare to present lessons in numerous ways that reach students on all levels under the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit.


Teachers will be challenged to think of ways they can improve in an effort to help impact students to develop a deeper desire and love for studying God's divine word.

AD2: Administrative Dilemmas and How to Solve Them

We live in a time of rapid change and trends and unfortunately The Church of our Lord is not immune to those changes. The Word will stand forever, but in an effort to instruct the people of God in the Word of God, the Education Administrator is faced with an even greater challenge in these changing times.

Can you say "covid". Never in our lifetime did we think that we would experience a pandemic that would drastically change how we do church. And the sad reality is that many of our churches are <u>still</u> trying to recover from the effects of this global virus. And so, as a result, the Education Administrator has added even more to what was already a full plate.

The Biblical foundation for Christian Education can be seen in Jesus' commission to the disciples in Matthew 28:19-20...

19 Go ye therefore, and **teach** all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: The evangelism piece is to teach all nations or make disciples.

20 **<u>Teaching</u>** them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, Io, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

The education piece is to teach the disciples that have been taught in the way of righteousness or in the doctrine of Christ.

And the way that you do that effectively is through a systematic method of disseminating information to the hearer.

Thus, the need for Education Administration comes into existence. So, what is an education administrator?

- Education knowledge acquired by learning and instruction. Activities that impart knowledge or skill.
- Administrator someone who manages or governs.
- Dilemmas a state of uncertainty or perplexity.

So as an Education Administrator, you manage or govern the gathering of knowledge or information that is imparted to the disciples through instruction or various activities.

And rest assured, that if you are to be successful, you will encounter some dilemmas.

Some areas that will be discussed during this workshop:

- Determining your Direction
- Strategies for Successful Staffing
- Training Teachers to Teach
- The Battle for Bible School Budgets

Just to name a few. But the good news is that we can be victorious over whatever dilemmas we might face, but to do that planning your work and working your plan must be a priority.
